DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

Vancouver Vagabond more than anything represents a coming of age for myself: a departure from the halcyon days of Art and fantasy in moviemaking, a bitter recognition of the reality of the business of movies and the ever precarious terms under which they are created and released. It became a nightmare, my career in filmmaking. What started out as a dreamy hobby and the obsessive deployment of my many skills became merely a game of finance, outside of the creative, outside of merit often enough, in the hands of a cynical and transient business elite. No roots, no loyalties, reality of the times had caught up with me.



July 13, 2005.

I awoke with a lucid vision.

I saw the opportunity before me. With the *Vancouver 2010 Winter Olympics* on the horizon, I stepped forth upon the new day and never looked back.

Vancouver Vagabond is the story of my experience as a small "c" canadian filmmaker amidst Hollywood North, of market forces, and the inside social and political back story of the host city, 2010.





Inside the Forest was that feature film, as it came to be 1999 – 2005, another slow build on smaller money and Heath's work equity as he found his way back into live action after a decade in art and animation.

Vancouver Vagabond is now this feature story. A reassembling of the pieces that would have otherwise been lost, the canadian filmmaker on the road again, running.





SYNOPSIS-1

Vancouver Vagabond, a bold, visionary doc-drama feature film debut from creator Heath Tait, is a visually arresting, darkly candid autobiographical account of his wacky and harrowing trip as a young artist-animator through the Gen-X 90's amidst Hollywood North and Canada's scandalous socio-political economic landscape inside America.

This is a story of exuberant youthful ambitions having turned to the dark side of loss and alienation; of dreams and reality, tender innocence and callous depravity.

The Canadian filmmaker, an age-old dilemma of burning need for one's craft, victimized by the soul smashing American market forces... it is an impassioned death march for most.

VV is Heath Tait's precarious film-maker voyage of decades, and he shares his experience in this documentary-drama, a revealing of discoveries made amidst Hollywood North and beyond. (30 words)

The story draws from sumptuous cinematic film imagery (16, S16, 35mm), some of the best material from Heath's media history and from over 200 raw, street-sweeping documentary video hours of developments and discussions, politicians, activists, analysts, journalists, business people, arts administrators, film industry associates, friends, family and the list goes on.

Heath's personal story is seated firmly within a landscape of postmodern times, archival footage from five sources detailing Canadian and American times past.





Using simple desktop Final Cut Pro software and a set of external hard drives, top results have been demonstrated through innovative, accessible pro-consumer means.



DAVE HARDY

Dave is very much a remnant of the "old" days of freelance film cutting in Canada, having adapted to digital means in more recent years. He helped create the Vancouver Film School and still teaches traditional film cutting alongside Final Cut Pro. Dave was Heath's editor from 2001 to 2005 on the feature *Inside the Forest*: the film that was adapted, becoming *Vancouver Vagabond*.




TOM METZGER

Since 2001, Heath has transferred VV's original film negatives to digital video with Tom, senior colourist and technician at Northwest FX & Imaging in Vancouver.






Post production Colour Timing: not limited to colour alone, but adding depth, sharpness and overall impact. Similar to Photoshop, only 24 pictures per second, it's a very rewarding final stage of the film making process.




JAMES COVELL

Peter Allen in Vancouver & **James Covell** in L.A., dreamt up the original scoring for *Vancouver Vagabond*, conceived as a hard rock opus with blends of ponderous urban, often melancholic washes. Masterfully choreographed with picture, this dance of sound design bespeaks something beyond narrative story telling, it is an animation of the senses.

Peter does it all. From the jazz and rock scene to the community church where he composes sacred music. An active member of the Canadian League of Composers and the Canadian Music Centre, he has been commissioned to compose an extensive array of productions for all media applications. Because of his extensive experience in such a wide variety of historic musical styles, Peter can create any kind of music, possibly combining elements together in new and interesting ways.

Though he's worked on larger productions, a favorite is *Flower & Garnet*., as above, a successful film out of Vancouver.

D.O.A., since 1978, is known as Canada's primary punk rock band, and the first in the world to premiere the term "Hardcore" in the hard rock scene. Based in Burnaby (Vancouver Metro), the band's music is featured in VV in six spots, including over the entire tail credits.



AIRWAVES Sound Design in Vancouver, in conjunction with Peter Allen and FX crew, provided a rich soundscape uncommon to most documentaries.

BIOGRAPHY

HEATH TAIT Creator of Vancouver Vagabond



Heath Tait grew up amidst fruit orchards, a fourth generation of the Okanagan Valley in the southern interior of British Columbia. An early penchant for make believe resonated in the 80's through special effects makeup, his high school horror videos embracing both dreams and techniques when advanced horror shows and Heavy Metal music were King.

Pictorial Forest, the multi-technique animation odyssey, was a passion project resolved through five years of Arts College and thereafter, spanning a decade. The short film's first of four awards was Gold at the 32nd Worldfest-Houston 1999.

Through the new millennium he has continued various artful and executive pursuits whilst writing a few feature film scripts, the second of which he has directed and produced as the 1st of a trilogy, *Vancouver Vagabond*.

Fine artist, animator and film maker, Heath Tait has been engaged in independent media production since 1987. He continues his quest in balancing Art and innovation with industry.

Heath visits Vancouver quite often.
